- “ Cadets who are preparing to contract with ROTC
 - . Contract: commit to completing ROTC in exchange for benefits

Why is the 104-R Important?

- “ Agreement between Cadet and ROTC
- “ Determines number of semesters of benefits
- “ Allows ROTC to forecast graduation and commissioning
- “ ROTC instructor, ROO, HRT, and PMS all review 104-Rs each semester





How to fill out the 104-R

- “ Cadets must be full time students
- “ Cadets must take a military history class
 - . Can be US Military History, Civil War, Vietnam War, Military Geography
 - . Should at least have a placeholder
- “ Summer classes
 - . Scholarship does not pay for summer classes (Engineering is exception)
 - . Can take classes during summer except between junior . senior year
